FEBRUARY HOST PROFILE

There were rumors in the pond we're having company again. The Feeder, who I've heard is a classification called "Nick", had been working like crazy around the place for weeks — a sure sign he's got something planned — before he finally said he was having a koi club

meeting. If you've been a member of his club for more than a year, you've possibly already visited our pond at least once. Many of you were here just last July for a meeting when the big wig from the bigger club came and talked to us about filtration.



From last July you might remember the glorious pink crape myrtle trees and all the roses and vegetables in the front yard. Of course, we've never seen them, but The Feeder's been futzing around out there a lot. He's had to replace a lot of veggies already (sometimes we get some of the lettuces); he was bragging about the 9"-wide broccoli crowns and cauliflower heads! He just cut back the roses, so they won't be blooming for you. But he hasn't cut any more precious redwoods in a while; the last few gave us a bit more morning sun. He's none too happy about cutting them either, but hey! we hear the redwoods aren't doing well all over town.... Arborists and specialists from UCR and the city have visited The Feeder's yard many time over the years to try to figure out what's been hurting our redwoods, but there's never been a definitive answer. Guess they're not so smart after all.

The Feeder built our pond 30 years ago; he chose the house just for the slope in the yard so he could have a real waterfall. Some of us had to wait in our old pond — 50 miles away! — until this was finished, and then we had to share with those pesky goldfish he insisted on buying to test the water quality. At one time, they multiplied so much there were over a hundred of them in here! Such promiscuity! And they get big — some were a foot long with fancy flowing tails. We were glad when a bunch of them got moved to a school somewhere. And we took sadistic delight the day a huge pelican spent the day here, diving from the roof to the pond. Can you believe it! He ate his share of them and only left because the neighbors alerted The Feeder's lady and she scared him off.

The thing is, those goldfish just didn't know how to hide. Once the club had a guy demonstrate "the Wright way to catch koi" here...Right! In this pond? Your members were all around the pond, above it and in front, on the deck and on the waterfall, but they couldn't catch us because we kept going around the island out of reach! We know that if The Feeder gets serious about catching us, he can drain half the pond and trap us on one side or the other of two walls he built in; they're for our safety if the bottom plumbing needs work, but they're a threat, too, and we're careful swimming over them, especially when the ladies are spawning. It can get rather rough in here!

None of our ladies have spawned in several years. The last time, three of them played princess, each having to have her own private party. Made *The Feeder* clean up after them three times in one week! When *The Feeder* finds babies in the big vortex settling tank, he rescues them and puts them in his inside aquarium; he thinks they're too small to be out here with us. Or he wants to keep an eye on them. He does that: grows 'em out in the house to four or five inches and then sends them back to us. This pond is a big shock to the poor little things!

The feeder is proud of our pond (he calls it his) and enjoys showing it off. We like the company, too, but the people spend so much time looking at the big trees, the flowers and all the rockwork that they kind of ignore us. We hear them say, "It's just not Riverside back here!" Of course it's not a river side — it's a pond — but some folks are a bit dense. 

ou missed a lot of valuable information if you missed this meeting, so I'll try to recap key points. Next month we'll be looking at how to help our koi and ponds make the transition from cold to warmer weather and water, a timely discussion even if we don't have a true Winter. Be there!



Hosts Larry & Debby, Riverside



So say the Japanese...and the koi will take care of themselves. Water quality is affected by six key issues and how well we handle them: the Nitrogen Cycle, Stress, use of Water Test Kits, O₂ & Nitrates, making frequent partial water changes (FPWC), and pond stocking density.

A **biologic filter** is a home for beneficial bacteria whose job it is to convert the ammonia [NH₃, which is toxic at high a pH] in pond water (created by decaying fish poop and mulm, and by our fish breathing) into Nitrite [NO₂, which is toxic at a low pH], and then converting that to Nitrate [NO₃, which is beneficial to plants in and out of the water, including algae]. Many ponders irrigate their yards with filter water.

Stress seriously affects koi health and comes from poor water quality. Koi live in water temps from $35^{\circ}F$ to $90^{\circ}F$, and tolerate any pH, but they <u>don't do change well</u>. They adapt readily, but not to <u>big</u> changes, such as no more than 5° up or 2° down in rapid water temperature changes. Ammonia, nitrite or nitrate levels over 20ppm will burn their gills, but take months to do it. Surprisingly, low O_2 levels affect your <u>larger</u> koi first. You can't always see stress, but it reduces a koi's first and best immune system defense, their slime coat.

Water Test Kits are tools to be used regularly, and there are four key kits. [1] Ammonia is the #1 killer of koi, more than all other factors combined. Test for it! [2] Nitrite has no allowable level; long term exposure to as little as 0.5ppm is lethal. Symptoms include gasping, lethargy, sitting on pond bottom, refusing food, clamped or red-streaked fins. Test it! [3] pH is a measure of H+ ions, and there is no right number or level. Koi don't care about it as long as they have a stable environment; pH should be between 6.5 and 8.6 without fluctuations. [4] Total Alkalinity (t.a. or KH) is a measure of the buffer for pH fluctuations. (All of these tests and issues need a lot more information than is provided here, and each koi keeper needs to have a clear understanding of the WHAT and WHY of testing.)

Oxygen $[O_2]$ is an absolute necessity for all life; splash, pump, aerate...and keep it circulating around and from top to bottom. Air pumps are very economical to run, with little loss in long air lines. For a waterfall, a sheet type with a large/steep drop is best; the alternative is a cascade with lots of rocks.

The single best thing you can do for your pond is **Frequent Partial Water Changes** [FPWC]: they increase alkalinity levels to make filters work better, reduce dissolved organics, replace trace elements, dilute growth-inhibiting pheromones, and reduce nitrates. How much, you ask? A minimum 10% per day, and if that seems like a lot, consider up to 50% per day for a heavily stocked pond

Finally, fish grow. While water volume and filtration capacity don't change, your **Stocking Density** does, and it grows exponentially. Assume ten koi in a new pond; in two years they may double in length, but body mass would be increased 8-fold, to the equivalent of 80 koi! That's 8x more Oxygen required, 8x more Ammonia produced. In two more years, as they double in length again, you'll have 8x 8x the mass — 64 times the body mass or the equivalent of 640 koi! Remember Mark Corser's 18,000-gal pond (August 2017 meeting)? It's home to just 20 enormous *Kohaku*...that's body mass!

There are also panels (visible behind pond in photo) that cover the pond to protect it during rain.

"The pond is put together with 3/8 x 6" lag bolts and deck screws for ease of disassembly and reassembly. The pond is still intact, so anyone interested can see the configuration. I cannot tear it down, so a buyer would need to take it apart; I recommend numbering all components so all the holes will align on reassembly."


