

Sleeves, and a Sequence pump. This is the third pond Steve has built at different residences where they have lived, and the couple find watching the movements of koi a very relaxing hobby.




Their family includes two adult children, two pretty parakeets, some Rosy

External Anatomy:Form – Koi have what is known as a <u>fusiform shaped</u> body (tapering toward each end) as seen in the diagram.



The <u>caudal</u> or tail fin is primarily used for forward swimming especially fast swimming. The <u>dorsal</u> (top) fin is used for stabilization during forward motion. The largest leading ray becomes very stiff, sharp and thorn-like as the koi grows older.

The <u>anal</u> fin, like the dorsal, is used for stabilization. Also, the largest leading ray becomes very stiff, sharp and thorn-like as the koi grows older.

The <u>pectoral</u> fins are paired and are used for numerous functions including: steering during forward motion, slow swimming both forward and backward, bracking and to counteract the jet effect of the water being forced out of the opercular openings.

The **pelvic** (or ventral) fins are also paired and serve to control pitch and roll and to counter lift.

### IKS COMMUNITY PROJECT WITH NORCO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS





Norco High School Pond Project

The Agriculture teacher known as Lindsey at NHS contacted Theo Zoetemelk of IKS for information and help in January 2018. Theo then started asking questions among IKS Members, trying to see if it was viable to help students build a simple koi pond.

He also managed to get several businesses to respond by donating items and approached the IKS Board about donating the yearly Scholarship (none awarded in 2018 or 2019) Inland Koi Society usually offers.

With several volunteers, a large area at the school, and a limited donation, the Pond Project was a 'GO'.

The teacher wanted the students to do the work so guidance has been happening, but slow on the work, as they understand the why's, how's and what's of Koi Pond Building.

After a Summer with no school our pond project was delayed, but now with school back in session we are gearing up for the finishing touches. The pluming is all finished, with bottom drain and skimmer. The vortex is in ground with the 4 filters in place. Now the waterfall and the pond liner are about all that is left. This project was all built by the students with guidance from IKS, Theo Zoetemelk, project director, who was assisted in help from Deanna Fales, Rob Fales, Tom Wright and Larry Leverett.


We had some help from our corporate friends, W.Lim Co. and The Pond Digger Eric Triplett who each donated some equipment. Right now the students are doing some landscaping and getting ready for the final push. Notes, sizes, equipment and work will be cataloged by these Volunteer IKS Workers, so if other schools, colleges, facilities, or people would like to experience building a koi pond in a simple, inexpensive way, there will be a printed guide for them.

When completed, we are planning a club meeting at the school sometime after the first of the year 2020, to show off their hard work.




nother ongoing community project that IKS has been working on is collecting pull-tabs from soda cans. Then every other year or so, IKS Volunteers travel to Redlands Loma Linda Children's Hospital, to donate these tabs for the monetary value of their weight given by the California Redemption Value.
