COVID Strikes Again: January & February Meetings ~ CANCELED

But now.... With COVID-19, the D-variant and Omicron — as well as flu and cold season — raging around us, we are calling another *Time Out*.

But we go to the Leveretts' in January so we can be cozy in their garage, out of potential wind or rain, and enjoy a video visit with one of the K.O.I. guest speakers. TIMELY INFO: OMICRON VARIANT PRIMER

If you haven't yet been hit with the Omicron variant, know that it doesn't look much at all like the COVID we've come to recognize... and it spreads faster than any previous version of the virus. It's estimated to make up more than 95 percent of COVID infection in the U.S. right now, and it's perhaps so fast-spreading because it is so different, especially in people who've been vaccinated. The five most common symptoms —plus one—with Omicron are:

Runny Nose ~ the most reported symptoms are those of the common cold or flu Headache ~ more likely to be frontal, felt in the forehead, not the back of the head Fatigue ~ extreme tiredness, all-encompassing exhaustion, for one or two days Sneezing ~ as it hits the upper respiratory system, it causes sniffles, congestion Scratchy Throat ~ not a sore throat, and no noticeable fever Night Sweats ~ repeated episodes of extreme drenching perspiration

Nasal congestion, dry cough, muscle pain or aches in the lower back are also regularly reported as early signs of the variant. Data is beginning to paint a clearer picture of how Omicron is different, including being more transmissible than Delta and evading the defenses provided by currently available vaccines. Symptoms are showing up within three days of exposure; current recommendations are to quarantine for five days, regardless of vaccination status., then continue to wear a mask and test before any 'indoor gatherings.'
