AROUND THE OVAL POND

Officers, Directors & Help-Line

The IKS Board generally meets on the second Sunday evening at 5:00 or 6:00 pm; they share hosting the meetings, providing simple refreshments or a dinner. Members are welcome to attend, but should let the hosts know their intention to do so.

The June 9 Board meeting, attended by 11 at the Milfelds', started at 6pm following dinner. It included the final review of the Auction.

- The 2019 Auction: We presented 78 lots with a total of 88 koi being sold to 48 Bidder/Buyers. We had a never-before-seen abundance of equipment for sale, but unfortunately relatively little of it was sold. There were numerous pumps and filter equipment left over or returned to the sellers. Net income exceeded the last three Auctions, including one with double the number of lots offered. Our take-away was to continue to limit the number of koi offered, keeping it in the 80-100 range. And we broke in a new auctioneer: Jack Marrin opened, Rob Fales took over after lunch.
- *Membership:* Renewals to date are 57, plus 9 new members, including four at the Auction. Five other Auction attendees expressed an interest in membership and will be invited to this month's meeting.

 - A field trip to Barstow Koi Farm is being researched for this Fall.
- Koi Rescue: •QT pool at the Kushners' was empty for all of a day. The two days of moving and handling koi for the Auction wasn't enough to keep the rescue team down: they spent all of Sunday removing 39 koi plus some equipment from a pond in the Newport area, halfway to another auction! •Thanks to the Team: Ed & Linda Kushner, Rob & Deanna Fales, Brenda Aker, Ed Broomfield, and Tom Wright.
- Norco HS Pond Project: Although school is out for the year, students are still working on the project. The skimmer and vortex are in place, the barrel filters are lined up with all the plumbing connections made, and they are waiting for a date to install the liner. Eric and Deanna Fales continue to work on blueprints and instructions for a project manual. This will be a continuing project into the next school year: a few of the students have graduated, but their replacements are ready to take over.



HOST PROFILE: JUNE 23

We haven't visited *Aiko Howo*'s home since March 2015. Back then, it was a treat to see the Japanese influence from the front yard and throughout the lushly landscaped back yard. Aiko had shared a few photos and a wonderful 'bio' to intrigue us, and after our visit, I had a lot more photos.

Aiko is a native Californian whose grandparents emigrated from Japan to the USA around 1900; her parents settled in Monrovia in the 1930's and became strawberry farmers. When WW II began, the family — and all other Japanese Americans this side of Arizona —were ordered into internment camps. They spent the war years in Wyoming, returned to Los Angeles, and eventually saved enough to buy a home. A gardener by trade, her father created a beautiful yard with a bonsai tree and a Japanese garden.

Retired after 30 years as a school nurse, Aiko had earned her BS in Nursing from San Diego State, her Masters in Education from Azusa Pacific, and her Pediatric Nurse Practitioner certification from USC. Her husband retired as a Lieutenant Colonel after 30 years in the Air Force. They have three accomplished children: Midori is a Chief Deputy District Attorney in Fresno, Michael is CFO of a local microchip company, and Mitchell is a family practice physician for Kaiser. Life after military bases meant settling in Redlands on a "hilly lot filled with weeds interspersed with grass" and spending the weekends battling said weeds.

After 25 years in the house, Aiko figured they were going to stay there, so in 2005 she began reshaping the property so she could create a Japanese garden. They flattened the yard and removed most of the lawn, leaving a small patch of grass for her dog, Sugar. I would have thought a koi pond to be a natural inclusion in the garden, but Aiko's interest was roused by a local pond tour: the peaceful and quiet spaces reminded her of her father's garden. The tour's pond builder willingly built her a pond but, like many novice pond owners, she learned too late that her beautiful pond was too shallow. After but a few months, most of her 10 koi had disap-

peared, presumably to the pudgy but majestic hawk living in the trees above her house.

Aiko joined IKS in June 2012, after the Redlands Pond Tour. She's learned more about ponds since then and had a second pond built—deeper, with better filtration. It was 11' x 16' x 3¹/₂' with a 4-inch

bottom drain in the 45mil liner. A 6500gph submersible pump returned filtered water to a 6' stream flowing into the pond.

he original pond was home to four rescued red-eared sliders (semiaquatic turtles), while the new pond housed 15 koi of assorted sizes and one turtle. Although single, the turtle has already laid two sets of eggs and the hatchlings are showing up in the koi pond filter. Clandestine late night trysts?*

F our years ago the koi pond had no fancy fishes, and most were rescued koi. Aiko initially purchased a few prized koi from Barstow Koi Farm on one of our club's field trips, but they were among those lost from the first pond. Most of her koi came directly from the generous Audrey Rowland, and a few have come from our previous auctions.

Aiko's closing comments made me laugh: "I hope my club membership is not revoked because I am embarrassed to confess that I get help maintaining my ponds. After spending hours fighting string algae (another battle lost), I gave in to a monthly pond service." Well, at least most of the women won't fault her; if it were up to us

to do it, we'd hire someone, too!

We'll hope for a beautifully clear day on Sunday, as close to Auction day weather as possible! Our everwilling speaker will be "*Koi Jack*" *Chapman*, who will talk about nutrition. Let's see a great turnout! Come with questions, your chairs, something yummy for the table and an appetite, and know that we'll have a good time — we always do!

Note that we're meeting an hour later in deference to the midday heat, so see you at 3:00pm!



Directions to Aiko's: 1335 Sterling Rd., Redlands

Obviously, you should find your own best route to Redlands; these directions take you to Aiko's from the north on the I-10.

- From the West, take I-10 east to Redlands; exit to Tennessee St south.
- Tennessee becomes **San Mateo St** and angles SE, then ends at Highland Ave.; turn **left on Highland**,
- Make the 1st right on San Jacinto St; go two blocks.
- Turn **right on Crescent**, immediately turn **left on Sterling**. It's the 4th house on the left with the Japanese front garden.
- From the East, take I-10 west toward Redlands; exit to Ford St / Redlands Blvd; stay on Redlands Blvd until you turn left on Highland Ave.
- Turn left on San Jacinto, then right on Crescent, and immediately turn left on Sterling Rd. Aiko's is the 4th house on your left.

Virtual Visits to Members' Ponds



Pondside Conversations

How Can a Koi Live in That?!



• First, all koi excrete ammonia, via the gills and anus, as a byproduct of metabolism. The amount of ammonia produced is dependent upon how much food they have consumed and their stress level.⁽¹⁾

• Second, ammonia comes in two forms, ammonia (NH_3) which is very toxic, and ammonium (NH_4) which is less toxic. The combination of these two are referred to as Total Ammonia Nitrogen (TAN).⁽²⁾ Most hobbyist test kits measure the total amount of both NH_3 and NH_4 ammonia, not just the highly toxic NH_3 .

• Finally, and this is important for koi transport, the ratio of these two forms ammonia is dependent upon pH and water temperature. The lower the pH, the more ammonium (NH₄) there is in the water. It is also important to note that ammonia will change back and forth between ammonia and ammonium dependent upon pH, oxygen and water temperature.⁽³⁾ Water temperature affects the conversion of NH₃ (highly toxic) to NH₄ (less toxic), in that as temperature rises the conversion from NH₃ to NH₄ is reduced. The higher the NH₃, the more toxic the water is in the bag. It is best to keep the transport bag cool (not cold) during transport.

Now let's talk about what's going on inside the bag. Within the bag, your koi will continue to consume oxygen (O_2) while excreting ammonia and carbon dioxide (CO_2) . When all the oxygen within the bag is consumed, your koi will die. In order to extend survival time, pure oxygen is added. Normally carbon dioxide released during metabolism will diffuse into the atmosphere. Because of the confined atmosphere, CO_2 converts to carbonic acid. This carbonic acid lowers the pH of the water, and the lower pH will convert highly toxic ammonia to less toxic ammonium.⁽³⁾ *Isn't low pH a bad thing?* Yes, but that is a conversation for another time. Just realize that, in this case, the low pH is what is keeping the koi alive.

A lot of science squeezed into two paragraphs. But to summarize, the addition of pure O₂allows the koi to breath for a longer period of time, and the decreasing pH lowers the toxicity of the ammonia which allows for a survivable environment.

Notice I said <u>survivable</u> environment. The water in a transport bag is a bomb waiting to go off. There is some debate about how long a koi can survive in a bag. Some koi have spent as long as 72 hours in transport. You should keep transport time to the minimum and, except in extreme cases, less than 24 hours. Additionally, your beautiful new koi is extremely stressed. Experiments have concluded that koi kept in a confined environment for 60 minutes suffered an 80% death rate when exposed to virus or bacteria.⁽⁵⁾ This is one of the reasons koi should be quarantined after transport, which will allow the koi to recover from the stress of transport and reestablish their immune systems.

When you are ready to put your koi into the pond, it is extremely important to note that as soon as you open the bag or allow pond water into the transport bag, the pH will immediately start to rise and the ammonia will increase in toxicity. Upon opening the bag, you must immediately remove the koi from the bag and not allow pond water to enter the bag, as this can rapidly kill your koi or initiate *delayed mortality syndrome*.^{(2),(3)} There is some concern that pond and bag water temperatures must be equal. While it is <u>best</u> that the temperatures be equal, as long as they are within 5°F it is safe to place the koi into the pond.⁽⁴⁾ If you suspect there is a greater than 5degree difference, float the bag in the pond for 10-15 minutes before releasing it.

I hope this demystifies how a koi can survive in a transport bag. This article was not intended as a how-to of koi transport, as that would make the article way too long and is best suited for another pond side discussion.

The more you know the better koi keeper you'll be.
